2009 YEAR AT A GLANCE

Dear Friends of HomeAid Colorado,

In a year which saw an increase in foreclosures, job loss, bankruptcies and subsequently homelessness, HomeAid Colorado's mission has never been more relevant. Yet, despite the historically difficult economy, 2009 was a remarkably productive year for HomeAid Colorado all thanks to the generosity of our donors and volunteers. We are proud to report to you on our accomplishments for 2009.



Angel Village, a duplex for Interfaith Hospitality Network. On April 22nd with builder captains Streamline Builders and Village Homes, HomeAid Colorado dedicated a duplex for homeless families in Loveland. With grant funding from the Boettcher Foundation, Gates Foundation and Colorado Garden Show Inc., HomeAid was able to build this shelter with green materials to reduce the long term energy impact and cost of operating the home.

Third Way Center Campus at Lowry for the Third Way Center. This one of a kind residential treatment campus for mentally ill youth in Denver provides a viable alternative to homelessness for at risk youth. This state of the art facility includes three new buildings in addition to the one already completed by HomeAid in 2007. A total of 32 youth reside at the campus and go to school while receiving necessary



treatment and care by skilled counselors. The dedication ceremony attended by Mayor John Hickenlooper and the State of Colorado's First Lady, Jeanne Ritter, marked the completion of HomeAid Colorado's largest project at 21,000 square feet.

Girls Hope home for Boys Hope/Girls Hope of Colorado.

Taking on one of HomeAid Colorado's rare remodel projects, Jan Knibbe of Camerata Homes completed this construction project for girls in just five weeks. The home which needed to accommodate four girls required bedroom and bathroom



additions along with new flooring, doors, trim and plumbing and electrical upgrades. Four girls who

have academic potential but are living in at risk environments have been given the opportunity to live in a beautiful home and receive the education they deserve.



Colorado Homeless Families. Steve Prokopiak, developer and board member for HomeAid Colorado facilitated the initial completion of a community garden for Colorado Homeless Families. With over 60 volunteers and \$15,000 in in-kind donations the families of Colorado Homeless Families will be able to begin gardening in the spring. This is the first stage in

a much larger project slated to take place in 2010. Site planning is already completed for builder captain, KB Home to build seven town home units for homeless families in 2010.

Since 2000 HomeAid Colorado has completed 31 housing units, adding 215 beds and donating more than 2.8 million dollars in in-kind labor and materials and services from the home building industry.

Thank you for your on-going support of HomeAid Colorado, and best wishes for a happy and healthy 2010.
