

## HomeAid Colorado and John Laing Homes Dedicate Lowry Treatment Facility

HomeAid Colorado and John Laing Homes announced the completion of the first Third Way Center residential treatment facility at Lowry. The completed home, named Hope Place, will house eight homeless teens with mental health disorders and behavioral issues.

John Laing Homes led the construction of Hope Place, supported by a team of roughly 40 contractors and suppliers.

"It has been a privilege for us to work with HomeAid and the Third Way Center on this ground-breaking project," says Rich Staky, division president of John Laing Homes. "Not only does it allow these teens to live in a real home where they're receiving the attention they deserve, but our employees rallied around Hope Place, making it a true labor of love for everyone involved."

The Third Way Center's Lowry Treatment Campus will ultimately consist of four ranch-style homes on 1.8 acres. The campus is the only treatment facility of its kind in Colorado.
